

Medication Assisted Recovery

Medication Assisted Recovery (MAR) is a treatment option where an individual receives medication proven to be effective in aiding recovery from a specific substance. These medications are not a substitute for illicit substances. These medications require a prescription.

OPIOID USE DISORDER

Buprenorphine and **Vivitrol** are two of the medications that are FDA approved to treat Opioid Use Disorder. Each medication works in different ways and may not be appropriate for everyone. Our Nurse Practitioner will discuss which option is a best fit for you.

ALCOHOL USE DISORDER

Vivitrol is a medication that has been FDA approved to treat Alcohol Use Disorder. This medication is available in a tablet form or a once-monthly injection. This medication may not be appropriate for everyone. Our Nurse Practitioner will discuss which option is a best fit for you.

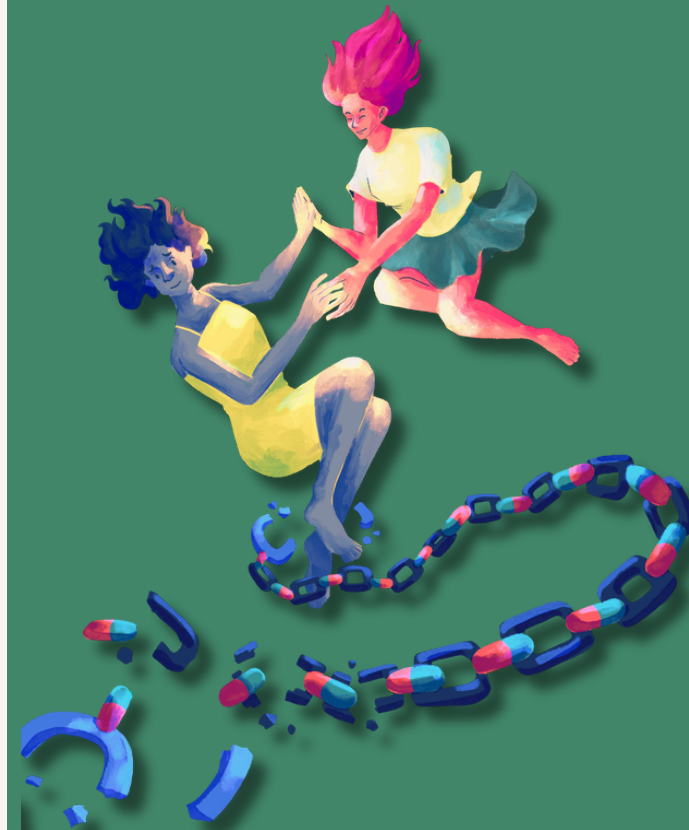

1. OUR TEAM

The STRONG Program is comprised of a Nurse Practitioner, medical staff, therapists, case managers, recovery coaches, and community partners.

2. OUR MISSION

Our mission is to empower individuals in the justice system to overcome addiction and reclaim their lives through comprehensive, compassionate recovery services. We provide personalized case management, medication-assisted treatment, peer support, and evidence-based therapy to help individuals break the cycle of substance use and incarceration.

Program Offerings

The STRONG Program offers two options:

- MARP course which assists individuals incarcerated more than 10 days and less than 90 days.
- Jail-based Residential: an intensive program designed to assist individuals incarcerated 90 days or longer.

Participants in either program can expect to receive:

- Recovery coaching
- Individualized care planning with our Case Manager
- Assistance obtaining medication for opioid use disorder or alcohol use disorder
- Community Referrals
- Discharge planning

Jail-based Residential participants can expect to receive:

- SMART Recovery
- Peer-led group meetings
- 1:1 therapy with a licensed clinician
- Personalized addiction medicine treatment with our Nurse Practitioner



ELIGIBILITY

You may be a candidate for this program if you

- are 18 years +
- identified as having Substance Use Disorder
- are a Wood County Jail inmate or EMP participant, or a DOC probation hold
- are willing to participate in the program voluntarily
