Domestic violence can impact any family at any time. The consequences of living with abuse can be isolation, depression, fear and lead to family dissention. Domestic violence providers are uniquely trained to counsel both men and women living in abusive relationships.

Family Center in Wood County has a shelter for abused women and children.

Coordinated Service Teams (CST)

Intensive case management team of adults who are vested in offering support for the child and their family. CST offers:

- * A child/family centered team approach Responding to individuals and families with multiple, often serious needs
- * In the least restrictive setting possible
 Balancing family, community support people, and
 service providers in support of the child.
 If you have serious concerns about the behaviors of
 your teen, talk to your school's guidance or
 counseling department.

Remember:

When a parent notices changes in their child's physical wellbeing, behavior or developmental milestones the first stop should be a complete medical evaluation by your child's physician to rule out any physical cause.

Many physical illnesses initially present as a change in behavior.

Mobile Crisis Response Teams

Certified mental health professionals can respond on-site to a client in a mental health crisis. Services offered for all ages. On-call responders assist law enforcement and others assess a mental health crisis for suicide risk and appropriateness of enacting a detention or arranging a diversion with community resources.

What are Employee Assistance Programs (EAP)?
