Scheduling an OWI Assessment

If you have been court-ordered/DMV required to complete an OWI Assessment and currently reside in Wood County, you will complete your assessment at Wood County Human Services. The current assessment fee is required at the time of scheduling your assessment. The OWI Assessment fee can be paid via cash, check or card. Please be aware the OWI Assessment fee is non-refundable.

OWI Assessment

The OWI assessor conducts a specific assessment (Intoxicated Driver Program Assessment) during your appointment. Based on the results, you are referred to the appropriate education or treatment program. A Driver Safety Plan outlines the recommendation of the OWI Assessment. The Driver Safety Plan is designed to educate and prevent future OWIs.

Cancelling your OWI Assessment

To cancel your assessment, you must do so at least twenty-four (24) hours in advance of your appointment. To cancel: call (715) 421-8840.

Failure to cancel your appointment within 24 hours or not at all, will result in a Rescheduling Fee of \$100.00 to schedule a new assessment.

Attending your assessment under the influence is prohibited. If you are found to be under the influence, the assessment will not be completed at that time, and it will result in an additional fee of \$100.00 to schedule a new assessment.

Driver Safety Plan

A Driver Safety Plan (DSP) is designed to meet your individual needs, based on the results of the assessment. The DSP may involve an education program, individual and/or group counseling sessions, treatment at a state-certified clinic, or a combination of these. You have options where you can receive these services. You must follow the DSP recommendations to remain in compliance or the Department of Transportation may suspend your driving privileges. You will have one year from the date of your assessment to complete all requirements of your Driver Safety Plan.

Noncompliance of the Driver Safety Plan

Failure to schedule an assessment appointment, failing to keep a scheduled assessment appointment, and/or failing to comply at any time with your Driver Safety Plan constitutes "Noncompliance" and the Wisconsin Department of Transportation is notified. Once notified, your driving privileges are suspended or revoked. You will be ineligible for licensing until you are back in compliance.
