1. Configured a repeater and duplexer, and installed them at the Courthouse temporarily, to run tests with the new proposed frequencies for the Jail.
2. Ongoing correspondence with the microwave hardware manufacturer regarding finalizing the new hardware order and required FCC license changes.
3. Responded to multiple 911 ALI / ANI modem line trouble tickets from Solarus and AT&T.
4. Completed required cyber security training from the IT Department.
5. Obtained a hardware quote to replace tower lights at the Powers Bluff and Nekoosa towers with LED units.
6. Made some programming changes to the console in Dispatch related to fire department paging, and to add new Dispatcher profiles to the 911-phone system.

October 2023 Activity Report

REPORTED TO COMMITTEE: 11/13/2023

1. WARNING & COMMUNICATIONS

- a. A spill of 3,000 gallons of process water (wastewater) was reported by ND Paper Mill in the City of Wisconsin Rapids on October 12, 2023. Spill was caused by human error when the operator left their post. 1,500 gallons of the release remained in the building, 1,500 gallons made it outside to gravel and the concrete pad. There are no waterways or storm drains nearby. Used pumps and hydro blaster/vacuum service for clean-up.
- b. A spill of 2,500 gallons of process water (wastewater) was reported by ND Paper Mill in the City of Wisconsin Rapids on October 13, 2023. Spill was caused when draining a tank and the water began to overflow from the holding tank. Still unsure if it was due to a clog in the drain or a failure in the tank. Spill was collected outside of the facility in pre-existing puddles from the ongoing storm. Unsure of the extent from there. Vac truck was called in to suck up all of the puddles surrounding the building.
- c. A spill of 275 gallons of curing compound was reported by Trierweiler Construction in the City of Marshfield on October 25, 2023. Spill was caused by a transportation accident when a truck swerved to avoid a deer and spilled over. All of the curing compound went into a nearby ditch. RP Does not believe the spill is harmful in any way, since this substance is routinely sprayed on and around roadways and driveways.
- d. A spill of less than 1 gallon of hydraulic oil was reported by Billerud in the City of Wisconsin Rapids on October 26, 2023. Spill was caused by equipment failure when a line broke on one of their mobile equipment pieces. It was estimated that half a gallon was released onto a paved surface. Due to the rain an unknown amount of that half gallon reached into a storm drain that leads to the Wisconsin River. A spill mat covered the storm drain, booms were used to contain the spill. Can see a sheen on the contained areas and contractors are not hired yet but plans to.
- e. A spill of an unknown amount of sump pump fluid was reported by Billerud in the City of Wisconsin Rapids on October 31, 2023. Spill was caused by human error when they were drilling in the ground to place railings for stairs when the auger drilled into the effluent lines. The spill is going to a nearby storm sewer which empties into the Wisconsin River. Company is working on getting the valve closed along with testing the water.

Notes: (The notes below reflect to the categories above in the y-t-d)

#2 – Calls for Service: North end Wood County received a total of 69 calls for service while the south end deputies received 29 calls. These are deaths reported from hospitals, hospice agencies, requests for scene deaths and cremation permit requests from funeral homes. Surprisingly, while the north end receives more

calls, it is the south end that has more requests for scene deaths. In October, the south end deputies received 8 requests for scene deaths while the north received only 5. I received a total of 10 calls/pages personally directed at me requesting reports and other information such as disinterment requests. These are only the calls that are paged via dispatch and does not include direct requests from individuals or funeral homes that have our cell numbers and call us direct.

#4 – Falls: Last month we had 2 cases where our elderly population had fallen, sustained serious injuries, and unfortunately succumbed to these injuries. The first, an 84-year-old individual fell and fractured his pelvis and the second was a 96-year-old individual who fell and fractured their hip.

#6 – Traffic fatalities: In October we responded to one motor vehicle accident that, sadly, claimed two young lives. One of the individuals was 14 years old and the other was 16 years of age.

#8 – Suicides: North end deputy coroners responded to a suicide involving a 29-year-old individual.

#10 – Overdoses: South end responded to a reported overdose related death. This was eventually confirmed with toxicology and autopsy. This, unfortunately, was a 44-year-old individual.

Re: User fee increase

Gentlemen,

Two years ago we increased the fees associated with cremation permits and death certificate signing from what was then \$100.00 to the now \$105.00. When we evaluated it at that time, even with the increase our fees remained very comparable to other counties at that time. Since we took that step, our surrounding counties have also increased their user fees. Wood County is still on the low end of user fee rates when I spoke to our local funeral homes.

Only one county, Portage, has not increased their fees. I believe that is because as a department they rely more heavily on tax monies rather than user fees for a budget. I was unable to find a chart that depicts what the other rates are for the state since the Wisconsin Coroners and Medical Examiners Association (WCMEA) has not updated it recently.

Since we increased our fees, everything else has increased as well. In looking back in the receipts from the past two years, the prices of just about everything we use has had an increase. Toxicology testing, body bags, cameras, syringes and needles – just about everything has had a fee increase.

Unfortunately, we have also seen an increase in the number of both indigent cases as well as state aid cases where our staff still receive their pay, but we are unable to bill for these services. Also, one of these years, I need to evaluate the need to potentially increase the per diem for the deputy coroners.

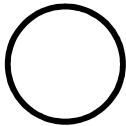
I would be looking at increasing the fees for the cremation permit and death certificate signing from the current \$105.00 to \$112.00. This increase of \$7.00 meets the standards of Wisconsin Statute 59.365 "Moratorium on fee increases." This statute limits the amount of fee increase no higher than the prior year percentage change in the U.S consumer price index. Last year, the consumer price index ended with a 7% increase.

I have spoken with the local funeral homes regarding this as they often deal with multiple counties and fees. All of them have agreed that this is fair and just as they realize the cost of everything has gone up. Their only request is to keep it simple, which I fully support for billing purposes, and that is to keep the fees in straight dollar amounts and not include cents in the billing (\$112.73) as so many counties do.

Please let me know your thoughts on this and what actions you would like me to take on the fee increase.

Security Services October 2023 Report

For the month of October 2023, the total number of prohibited items prevented from entering the Courthouse are:

Guns -	0
Knives -	80
O.C. -	11
Misc. Items -	11

The miscellaneous items that were located were shotgun shells, two (2) window punches, a screwdriver, a wrench, pruning shears, crochet needles and four (4) pairs of scissors.

Security Services screened 7,708 people entering the courthouse in October. Security Services had 41 security requests from different departments within the Courthouse for the month and we had two jury trials. We also served four civil process paper, posted two (2) evictions and fulfilled four (4) warrants in October.

Security Services handled 11 complaints in the jail this month. The reports were for criminal damage to property, a fight, drugs found, a theft and a sexual abuse complaint.

Additionally, Security also handled a vehicle lockout complaint in the parking lot of the courthouse, took an inmate to the emergency room for medical clearance and had to take an individual out of court and escort him to the jail so a drug test could be done on him. By the way, the test results tested positive for meth, cocaine, THC and ecstasy.

During the Month of October, I utilize part-time employees for 12 hours to fill employee shortage hours. Several shifts ran short due to no part-time employees able to help.
