1. WARNING & COMMUNICATIONS

- **a.** A spill of 2000 gallons of manure was reported by Sundstrom Pit Pumping in the City of Nekoosa on November 9, 2022. Caused by an intentional or illegal dumping (someone had cut the hose). Was cleaned up through a vacuum.
- **b.** A spill of an unknown amount of wastewater was reported by ND Paper in the City of Wisconsin Rapids on November 18, 2022. Caused by a pump failure causing effluent (liquid waste from the paper making process) to be released. Clean up took place by pulling wastewater into a process sewer through the parking area/docks along with placing sand at the river bank to stop it from going into the river.
- **c.** A spill of 2 gallons of mill effluent was reported by Domtar Paper Co LLC in the City of Nekoosa on November 22, 2022. Caused by the slow dripping from a frozen valve over a period of days. Clean up involved removing the ice buildup and replacing the valve. Domtar states the spill in the river will dissipate naturally.

Notes: (The notes below reflect to the categories above in the y-t-d)

- 1. Had someone told me that Wood County has approximately 110 deaths per month, I simply would not have believed it. Not all these deaths are Wood County residents, thankfully. Due to our exceptional health care system in Wood County, many of these individuals come from surrounding counties and states and unfortunately succumb here. Our office is still directly involved with these cases.
- 2. Unfortunately, the totality of this number is very low from the true number of calls I and our Deputy Coroners receive. As we progress, more agencies have our personal cell phone numbers to contact us directly. Once either myself or a deputy coroner has contacted individuals regarding a decedent, they are given our personal cell phone numbers for simplicity of avoiding calling dispatch only to have us paged out.
- 3. This is the total number of deaths due to natural causes that are signed by this office. This also includes Covid related deaths as they are considered "natural." Despite the minimal number of Covid cases, these numbers remain consistently higher than in prior years.
- 4. This past month saw 5 of our elderly population succumb due to injuries that resulted from accidental falls. Granted, while this specific number indicates when the actual death occurred versus when the injury occurred it does not consider when the injury occurred. Unfortunately, due to the varied possible injuries, it could be days, weeks, months or in some cases years before this population succumbs to their injuries. When they do occur, we are responsible to look back and see how much the injury attributed to the death.
- 5. Seeing that this month's Covid related deaths originated from other counties, they do not count as Wood County Covid deaths. Our office still signs the death certificates and then the appropriate county is notified of the death for their respective reporting. Overall, our Covid numbers have been exceptionally low compared to this time last year.
- 6. Having only 6 traffic fatalities at this point in the year is good. Considering how many people travel on our roads and highways, I would have expected more but am pleased this number has remained consistently low.
- 7. I'm glad to see that we have had none of these. When the current Wood County ordinance changed, allowing UTV's to operate on certain roadways, I was

- expecting a couple. I believe this is due to training, education and enforcement activities that keep operators safe.
- 8. Sadly, this number keeps increasing. Unfortunately based on our investigation one of these this month is related to our only homicide case to date.
- 9. We had our first homicide of 2022 on the north end. It presented with multiple challenges that we learned from in the event this occurs again. Thankfully these types of calls for Wood County are the exception and not the norm.
- 10. One overdose death is too many, and they're all young, otherwise healthy individuals. This latest case is yet again Fentanyl related. It's funny as a former paramedic and now coroner to see how beneficial Fentanyl is and how devastating it can be. Unfortunately Fentanyl is continuing to be mixed with Methamphetamine and in worse cases, sold and labeled as Oxycontin by people.
- 11. To date, we have had cases of hypothermia, choking victims, a victim of a house fire and positional asphyxiation. For November, I unfortunately must add another elderly person who succumbed to hypothermia and an infant who succumbed due to improper bedding in the crib.
- 12. The number of total death certificates signed by our office has remained consistent. This number is up from last year and I expect it to remain higher. While we are signing more, as with cremation permits, these fees are covered and do generate revenue as we charge for these fees.
- 13. We are currently averaging 75% cremation permits to traditional burials. My belief is that this trend will only continue to increase as people are looking for a more fiscally sound option when making choices for the final disposition for themselves or loved ones.
- 14. Currently, with 16 autopsies performed this year, this is the most this office has ever done. While most of our autopsies are performed for suspected drug overdoses, only 1 out of the 3 for this month was for that reason. The other 2 were performed out of medical necessity for determining cause of death.



AGREEMENT

This Agreement is made and entered into this 27th day of 0ctoba, 2009, by and between Wood County, a municipal corporation whose primary address is 400 Market Street, Wisconsin Rapids, WI 54494, hereinafter referred to as "County" and the South Wood County Humane Society, whose address is 90 Pepper Avenue, Wisconsin Rapids, WI 54494, hereinafter referred to as "Humane Society."

Whereas, the parties look to utilize the knowledge and skills of the Wood County Humane Officers (Humane Officers) to respond to various animal complaints throughout Wood County, in lieu of other persons legally able but less qualified to respond to such complaints, and

Whereas, the parties wish to utilize the funds generated through the dog license tax for the care and well being of dogs in the county, and

Whereas, the parties look to support the work of the Humane Society in caring for dogs and other animals.

Now, therefore, the County and Humane Society agree as follows:

A. The County agrees to do the following:

- 1. Beginning on January 1, 2009, to annually allocate \$12,500 of the Dog License Fund to the Humane Society. The Dog License Fund consists of the annual revenues the County receives in dog and cat license fees.
- 2. To make available one or more Humane Officers to respond to reports of animal complaints within the county.
- 3. The Humane Officers shall be compensated solely by the County. Said compensation consists of per diem payments that are equal to the per diems paid to Wood County Board Supervisors. The Humane Officers also receive mileage reimbursement at the rate set by the Internal Revenue Service.
- 4. On a semi-annual basis the County shall provide a written report to the Humane Society on the responses the Humane Officers made during the prior 6 months to the various animal complaints.

B. The Humane Society agrees to do the following:

- 1. To pay to the County \$10,000 of the funds it receives as dog license fees as reimbursement for the per diem and mileage expenses incurred by the County in having the Humane Officers respond to animal complaints within Wood County.
- 2. To utilize the funds paid to it by the County pursuant to this Agreement for collecting, caring for, and disposing of dogs, pursuant to Wisconsin Statute section 174.09(2).

C. The County and Humane Society further understand and agree as follows:

1. The County and the Humane Society are separate and independent legal entities.

2. The Humane Officers are agents of the County, whose actions are controlled

by state law and the County.

3. In lieu of making semi-annual payments to each other, the County shall pay to the Humane Society \$2,500 on or before December 1 for each year this Agreement is in effect.

4. If either party is unable to or anticipates being unable to perform an obligation they have under this Agreement, said party shall notify the other party accordingly in writing. Upon such notification, the parties will together determine if the Agreement shall be amended or terminated.

5. Either party may terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days written notice

to the other party.

6. Revisions to this Agreement must be set forth in writing and signed by an authorized representative of each party.

Neither party may assign this Agreement without the prior written consent of

Security Services November 2022 Report

For the month of November 2022, the total number of prohibited items prevented from entering the Courthouse are:

Guns - 1 Knives - 87 O.C. - 10 Misc. Items - 14

The miscellaneous items that were located were; two empty holsters, two loaded magazines, shotgun shells, three scissors, three screwdrivers, two corkscrews and a chain. The subject with the gun had their concealed carry permit. They were instructed on the law and they returned the weapon to their vehicle without incident.

Security Services screened 7,135 people entering the courthouse for the month. Security Services had 18 security requests from different departments within the Courthouse.

We had two jury trial go for the month. The one jury trial was the second week of the Sarver trail. Security also responded to three different jail incidents that required reports or citations.

November 8th was election night. Security had to open the courthouse, after hours, for the clerks of the county to come and drop off ballots. The courthouse was also closed this month on the 24th and 25th for the Thanksqiving Holiday.

For the month of November, I utilize part-time employees for 20 hours. These part-time hours covered full time deputies' time off.
