Sheriff Becker recommended a quarterly meeting between Dispatch, Sheriff's Department and towing companies. Supervisor Hamilton volunteered to take the lead on being the representative from the committee for trainings and follow up on this item.

1. Made many MABAS related changes to the programming macros for paging various fire departments throughout the County at the request of the County Fire Chiefs.
2. Added a new Dispatcher profile to the 911-phone system in Dispatch and removed several of those from people that have left.
3. Responded to two early morning calls from Dispatch. The second was caused by a tree falling onto power lines causing them to break and rip off of two poles at Powers Bluff. Notified Alliant, and was on site, and in contact with Dispatch and other tenants, until power was restored, almost 10 hours after I was notified.
4. Received a Sunday night call regarding Dispatchers having problems dialing out on voice over IP lines in Dispatch. Worked with Network staff from IT to correct the problem. Followed up with Dispatch and IT the following Monday.
5. Corresponded with a site developer regarding some more questions related to open space on a tower in Marshfield.
6. Provided Wisconsin Rapids Fire Department a copy of their FCC radio license as part of their accreditation application.
7. Responded to an after-hours call of the ALI & ANI information not coming through on 911 calls in Dispatch. Corrected, and made a test 911 call to verify proper operation.
8. Worked with a vendor on several things related to radios and radio equipment ordered for the Highway and Transportation Departments.
9. Completed required Safety and Civil Rights training from the Human Resources Department.
10. Worked with IT on a problem where the server for the microwave link equipment would not restart a service after regular software updates were performed.

11. Participated in the regular Next gen 911 ESINet PSAP project meetings facilitated by the AT&T project manager.
12. Communicated with the Safety and Risk Specialist on some bills related to the lightning strike at Powers Bluff earlier this year.

Remarks:

Tablets: I personally met with IT staff in late December to finish setting up the tablets. The storage was set up on each of them so they each have a

personal area and a common shared area. I was given access to all areas accessible from my County computer. We will be getting a couple of these out for trial in early January. We felt the best way to implement the tablets was to issue a couple of them to our busier deputies and work out any “kinks” if necessary, prior to issuing all of them out and then having to retrieve all of them if we needed to make changes. I look forward to the implementation as this will allow for better communication within the Coroner’s office.

Report: We now have a full year of this updated monthly report format. While it involves more time, I find it is more beneficial to you. It explains what is going on with respect to the Coroner’s office and offers more information on types of deaths that occur. While we only have one year of data, it will allow us to evaluate and monitor specific deaths or trends from year to year. If you would like to see additional changes or categories that are needed, please feel free to contact me so I can make them. Unfortunately, it has also shown us that falls, suicides and overdoses are our leading causes of death, excluding natural. Sadly, these are also the classes that are potentially the most avoidable and needless deaths.

Notes: (The notes below reflect to the categories above in the y-t-d)

1. This is the total number of deaths that occur monthly. Fortunately, due to our advanced health care systems and geographical locations, not all of these are Wood County residents.

2. This is the total number of times members of the coroner's office are paged out by Wood County Dispatch using the "I Am Responding" system. Many times, we are called directly by funeral homes or family members directly to discuss ongoing cases and to request either death or cremation permits.

3. This is the number of deaths that are investigated by our office and deemed as a “natural” death. This also includes Covid cases that have been deemed contributing to the death of the decedent.
4. Sadly, other than natural causes, this is the leading cause of death in our elderly population. I will continue to work with outside agencies where possible to ensure the safety and prevention of these injuries within the elderly population. The elderly, after sustaining an otherwise non-lethal injury, simply don’t do well and easily succumb due to inanition or “failure to thrive” post injury.
5. We saw a sharp decrease in the number of Covid related deaths after the first two months of the year. In review of the most recent Covid deaths, these are no longer younger, otherwise healthy individuals. Covid related deaths now seem limited to elderly people with multiple comorbidities or people with compromised immune systems. I will continue to track these numbers and see what this virus continues to do. So far, we have not experienced the sharp increase in Covid deaths around this same time as we have in the previous two years.
6. We finished off the year with 7 traffic fatalities on Wood County roads this year. With the numbers of vehicles, roads and highways in Wood County, I found this surprisingly and thankfully low.
7. We had no reported snowmobile or UTV related deaths this year. While we did have reported accidents involving these vehicles, none were fatal.
8. We ended up with a reported 14 suicide cases for the year. While I specifically left out the manner with respect to the specific cases, I can tell you they have occurred involving a variety of methods. While this number may seem low, I feel that we could do more to prevent these deaths.
9. We ended the year with only 1 reported homicide case. Thankfully, within Wood County, these cases appear to be a rarity and not a “normal” part of life that some communities face.
10. Ending the year with 17 overdose cases seems unreal. However, the number is 20 (accounting for overdose suicide deaths.) The 17 are cases involving cases of

illicit drugs which are ruled as “accidental” in manner. While this number seems low, they do account for most of our autopsy cases.

11. For the year, these cases included: Choking (foreign body airway obstruction); a victim of a house fire; positional asphyxiation; several cases of hypothermia involving elderly residents and one infant who suffocated due to improper bedding.

12. This is the total number of death certificates signed by this office (471) for the year. That is approximately 39.25 cases per month or 67.29 cases per member in the office for the year. This is considering we added two additional deputy coroners in April of 2022. This is done all with part time/on call staff.

13. We ended the year by signing a total of 995 cremation permits. What this involves is taking the initial call reporting the death and either viewing the decedent at that time or at a local funeral later and looking into cause and manner of death prior to issuing permit. Again, not too bad with part time staff.

14. With a total of 18 autopsies performed for the year, a bulk (15) were suspected drug overdoses. Only 3 were medically required for determination of death. Unfortunately, due to billing errors on the part of UW Madison, we will pay for a total of 22 autopsies this year (4 autopsies from 2021 were not billed for.) Not all the suspected drug overdoses were autopsied due to the fact that we were able to ascertain medical records and determine that the individual had underlying medical conditions that could be contributed to death as well. For 2023 I would like to reevaluate how we handle these cases. We don’t need to autopsy these cases the day after the event. I would like to take a “pump the brakes” attitude and see what we can find and what law enforcement can build on a case-by-case event prior to arbitrarily going to autopsy. We spent \$22,500.00 just in autopsies for suspected drug overdoses.

Recently, I was tasked with looking into jackets and badges for the Coroner's office members. Below please find what I have found with respect to these items.

Badges: Our style of badge is available through Galls at the cost of \$140.00 per badge including clip on badge holder. This is cheaper than going through Blackington Badge and they are in fact Blackington badges exactly as we have now. With the addition of two deputy coroners, we need to purchase two.

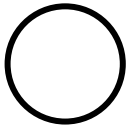
Jackets: I went through the entire Galls Public Safety catalog looking for jackets that best suit our needs. I selected the 5.11 Tactical 3 in 1 coat. The cost is \$270.00 per coat. This is a universal coat that will be suitable for all seasons. It breaks into separate components that can be used as a raincoat, or with all components could be used in the dead of winter. Furthermore, it is ANSI rated with reflective trim for use on roadways for further safety. While I am fully aware of the cost, we would only need to purchase 5. Both myself and Deputy Coroner Travis Patton currently own this system. It has worked perfectly for our use.

I originally purchased this system for us about a year ago. I wanted something that was multi seasonal, professional looking and had safety in mind as well.

Please let me know your thoughts on these two issues. Budget wise I will certainly follow up with Finance and see if this is possible. With 5 coats and 2 badges ordered from Galls, our cost would be around \$1,630.00.
